10 Easy Games (No Prep Needed)

1. I Spy (All ages)

One person says ‘I spy with my little eye...’ and gives a color/shape clue.

2. Would You Rather? (All)

Take turns asking two silly choices. Great for laughs.

3. The Story Chain (All)

One person starts a story; each person adds a sentence.

4. Memory Builder (Ages 5+)

‘I’m packing...’ plus an item. Next repeats and adds one.

5. 20 Questions (Ages 6+)

Think of a person/place/thing. Others ask yes/no questions to guess.

6. Name That Tune (Ages 6+)

Hum a song (no lyrics). Others guess.

7. Alphabet Game (Ages 6+)

Find words on signs starting with A, then B, and so on.

8. Categories (Ages 8+)

Pick a category (animals, foods). Go around naming items no repeats.

9. Two Truths and a Tall Tale (Ages 8+)

Say 3 statements—2 true, 1 made up. Everyone guesses the lie.

10. License Plate Letters (Ages 8+)

Find plates containing specific letters to spell a word.
